## Your Success/Grade In This Class Will Depend On:

- Doing all assigned work with honest effort
- Turning work in on time and consistently
- Coming to class prepared and on time

### Helpful Hints for a Successful Year:

- Write <u>ALL</u> assignments in your planner (or another organizer) at the beginning of the period. Have your parents sign at the end of the week.
- Consult your agenda at home and complete assigned work.

### **Rules and Consequences**

1. You are expected to **arrive to class on time** every day, and be ready to work when the bell rings. Shirts **must** be tucked in. A parent note is required when not in uniform.

Consequence: It is important that each student is in their seat and working on bellwork/assignments when the bell rings. *Tardiness may result in detention*.

2. <u>Assignments are due on time.</u> Homework is accepted the day it is due. Projects and assignments lose points each day they are late.

3. If you are absent from my class <u>it is your responsibility to make up any work</u> you have missed. Acceptance of any late or make-up work will be decided on a case by case basis (i.e. off island trip, medical reason) There are several ways you can find out what work you have missed:

- Visit PowerSchool website
- Asking a peer/classmate
- See Mr. Bautista during break/lunch

4. Show respect for the teacher as well as your classmates at all times.

#### Examples of disrespect:

- Talking while Mr. Bautista is speaking to the class
- Talking while other students share their ideas to the class. This includes whispering. You are required to listen to other students who share their thoughts
- Using insulting or derogatory language (for example: racially-driven words, name calling, cursing, or "dissing" the ideas and insights of others in class)

**Classroom Expectations –** Be safe, Be respectful, Be responsible. Refer to the student planner for the school rules if needed. All school rules apply in the classroom and addition to our class expectations.

### **Infraction and Procedures:**

- First Offense: A verbal warning will be given
- Second Offense: A second verbal warning will be given and parent contact will be made either by phone or email
- Third Offense: A referral will be given and the student will be sent to the office
- Fourth Offense: A parent-teacher conference will be requested (depending on severity).

#### Attendance/Tardy Policy:

All students must provide a parent note explaining the reason for being absent. A doctor's note may be required for absences that are 3 or more days. Prearranged absences must be scheduled with the main office and guidance counselor if the absence is for 3 or more days. Suspended students must get clearance from the discipline office before returning to the classroom.

Students must have a pass/note when coming to class tardy. For example, if the student came from the office or library, a pass must be presented. If a student comes in late from break or lunch without a valid reason he/she may be put into detention or lose certain privileges (i.e. field trip, student activities). Excessive unexcused tardiness and absences will be reported to the truant officer.
